Dear Chancellor Davis:

We would like to change the credit hour waiver for the major in Music Therapy under the B. Mus. degree from 122 to 129 credit hours.

The change is requested to meet the accreditation standard of The American Music Therapy Association, which has been modified to include additional clinical work. The clinical experiences are required for graduates to obtain Music Therapy Board Certification, an imperative credential for those wishing to practice in the profession.

The major in Music Therapy is currently approved for 122 credit hours for graduation. As a result of this revision, the major will now require 129 hours. This increase will not affect the ability of students to complete the program of study within four years.
