The committee approved the following items which were forwarded to the Executive Committee of University Council for consideration:

Proposal for an External Degree Program:

Major in Adult Education (M.Ed.) via Distance Education

Proposed Dual Degree Program Policy

The committee approved the revision of the Residency Requirement Policy with the following wording added: “Some majors may require more than the minimum of 15 semester credit hours.” The revised policy was forwarded to the Executive Committee of University Council.

The committee considered a request from Dr. Ann Crowther to review how write-in courses are evaluated. The committee approved a response that will be sent to Dr. Crowther that gives the department of the student’s major the authority to determine whether a write-in course may be used to satisfy the degree requirements for the major.

The committee discussed whether or not Areas A-E should remain as required entrance requirements for all undergraduate majors.
